It combines knowledge of theory with attention to personal growth and purpose, as well as health and wellness. Students learn to become citizens who care for themselves and others, ready to work with people in their communities. Participation in group activities and collaborative projects is a central focus of this emphasis, allowing students to experience group interactions in a variety of contexts. This emphasis includes lower division coursework that prepares students for potential careers in people/community oriented professions including social, health and recreational services.

To acquire the Associate of Arts Degree in General Studies with an Emphasis in Social Behavior and Self-Development, students must complete the required major courses below with a grade of "C" or better along with one of the following:
