DIVISION OF BEHAVIORAL & SOCIAL SCIENCES SOCIAL JUSTICE STUDIES WITH AN EMPHASIS IN LGBTQ+ STUDIES FOR TRANSFER ASSOCIATE IN ARTS DEGREE

The Associate in Arts in Social Justice Studies with an Emphasis in LGBTQ+ Studies for Transfer (AA-T) is intended to meet the lower division requirements for Social Justice majors (or similar majors) at a California State University (CSU) campus that offers a Social Justice Studies baccalaureate degree. This degree is designed to give foundational knowledge in the field of social justice for students looking to transfer, or for those who want a greater understanding of social justice among particular populations, and specifically the LGBTQ+ community.

In addition to the courses listed below, the following additional requirements must be met for completion of the Associate in Arts in Social Justice Studies with an Emphasis in LGBTQ+ Studies for Transfer Degree:

- 1. Completion of a minimum of 60 CSU-transferable semester units.
- 2. Achievement of a minimum GPA of at least 2.0 in all CSU-transferable coursework (some majors may require a higher GPA; students should consult with a counselor for more information).
- 3. Completion of the major with a grade of "C" or better in each course or a "P" if the course was taken on a Pass/No Pass basis and the "P" is equal to a "C" or better.
- 4. Certified completion of the California State University General Education-Breadth (CSU GE) pattern; OR the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) pattern.
